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#### The Wedding at Cana - John 2.1-12

- "My hour has not yet come"
  - A. Usually a reference to Christ's death & resurrection/glorification
  - B. Paraphrased "The hour of Great wine has not yet come"
    - 1) Wine would flow liberally in the Messianic Age (Jer. 31.12; Amos 9.13-14)
    - 2) The wedding symbol is used to describe the Messianic Age (Matt. 22.1-14; 25.1-13)
    - 3) Jesus is the Messianic bridegroom (John 3.29; Eph. 5.22-33; Rev. 18.23, 19.7, 21.2, 9)

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### The Wedding at Cana - John 2.1-12

- "Fill the jars with water"
  - A. In keeping with the theme of Jesus' superiority:
    - 1) The empty jars of purification represent the fading Jewish system
    - By filling the jars with wine, Jesus demonstrates the superiority of the Messianic Kingdom

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- a) The sheer quantity symbolizes the lavish blessings in Christ
- b) The quality of the wine is far superior

### The Wedding at Cana - John 2.1-12

- "The first of His signs"
  - A. John often refers to the miracles of Jesus as "signs"
    - 1) The were more than just sheer demonstrations of power, they served as evidence to His deity (John 20.30-31)

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- 2) It resulted in a strengthening of the disciples faith
- 3) Jesus' glory was seen (John 1.14)
- Doesn't negate the warning passages about alcohol.

#### Jesus Cleanses the Temple - John 2.13-25

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- "Take these things away"
  - A. God is angered when we profane His things
  - B. Jesus demonstrates righteous anger
    - 1) Jesus was concerned with the pure worship of God
    - 2) We must not profane the worship of God

#### Jesus Cleanses the Temple - John 2.13-25

- "Destroy this temple, and in three days I will raise it up"
  - A. Jesus cleansed the temple and would later replace it
  - B. This would be the greatest sign of Jesus' authority
    - 1) If Jesus had the power to rebuild the temple in such a manner, then He certainly had the authority to dictate how worship was to be conducted in it

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- 2) The resurrection is the crux on which Christianity rests (1 Cor. 15.17-27)
- 3) This sign would bring about absolute faith in His disciples
