

Luke 15:3-6
When the sheep wanders, Jesus makes the effort to bring it back.

Eph. 1:22-23
Jesus is head.
Church is body.
Body
accomplishes
what head
thinks.

When the church seeks to save the wanderer, that is Christ seeking to save the wanderer.



Theologically

One's belief and teaching has wandered from the Lord when:

- 1. It lifts up ungodliness
- 2. It overthrows other's faith.
- 3. It tears apart unity.
- 4. It violates gospel's purpose.
- 5. It evidences pride.

The steps to bring the wanderer back:

1 Tim. 1:3 – Charge to give up error.

Titus 1:9-11 - Elders take lead.

Titus 3:10 – If charge not obeyed, must be rejected.

Forsaking is a sign of spiritual weakness and a violation of Christ's will for you.

(23) - Hold onto faith!

(24) – Help others grow!

(25) – Gather for worship!

(26) - Salvation is at stake!

- 1 Thes. 5:14 Our guide for dealing with wanderer:
- 1. Find him, determine why he has left.
- 2. If fainthearted COMFORT.
- 3. If weak UPHOLD.
- 4. If just unruly WARN.
- 5. Treat with patience.

Heb. 10:23-25

2 Thes. 3:14-15 If he refuses the comfort, rebels against the effort to strengthen, will not heed the warning: Note him as a brother in error, refuse to keep company, continue to show concern for his soul.
