

# Prayer and protection

- <sup>1</sup> In you, Lord, I have taken refuge;  
let me never be put to shame.
- <sup>2</sup> In your righteousness, rescue me and deliver me;  
turn your ear to me and save me.
- <sup>3</sup> Be my rock of refuge,  
to which I can always go;  
give the command to save me,  
for you are my rock and my fortress.
- <sup>4</sup> Deliver me, my God, from the hand of the wicked,  
from the grasp of those who are evil and cruel.
- <sup>5</sup> For you have been my hope, Sovereign Lord,  
my confidence since my youth.
- <sup>6</sup> From birth I have relied on you;  
you brought me forth from my mother's womb.  
I will ever praise you. (Psalm 71:1-6)





# Prayer and protection

- <sup>9</sup> Do not cast me away when I am old;  
do not forsake me when my strength is gone. (Psalm 71:9)
- <sup>14</sup> As for me, I will always have hope;  
I will praise you more and more.
- <sup>15</sup> My mouth will tell of your righteous deeds,  
of your saving acts all day long—  
though I know not how to relate them all.
- <sup>16</sup> I will come and proclaim your mighty acts, Sovereign Lord;  
I will proclaim your righteous deeds, yours alone.
- <sup>17</sup> Since my youth, God, you have taught me,  
and to this day I declare your marvelous deeds.
- <sup>18</sup> Even when I am old and gray,  
do not forsake me, my God,  
till I declare your power to the next generation,  
your mighty acts to all who are to come. (Psalm 71:14-18)
