An allegory?

Not historical, but a vehicle for some deeper spiritual truth.

A typology?

Historical, with a parallel link to a New Testament truth.

A historical event?

Based on fact, a simple love story.



Song of Solomon's purpose?

Solomon, a Shulamite girl, and a shepherd.

The power of true love of a person over love of material things.

Solomon and Shulamite.

The power of true love to bridge major social differences.

Shepherd and Shulamite.

Love conquers all!

Gal. 5:19 - Work of the flesh.

1 Cor. 6:18 - Flee it.

1 Thes. 4:3 - Abstain from it.

Heb. 13:4 - God will judge it.

1 Cor. 7:2 - Marry to avoid it.

The danger: "A fox in the vineyard!"

Be Careful!
